



AVILA PIER DONOR PLAQUE AGREEMENT AND APPLICATION



PROGRAM GUIDELINES

Each donor is limited to one application. The donor must provide Friends of Avila Pier (FOAP) with the exact inscription desired for the plaque. Inscriptions must adhere to the following guidelines:

1. For memorial and remembrance plaques, do not include dates of deaths or terms such as "in memory of ...", "in remembrance of ...", or "survived by ...". Instead, language should be similar to "in celebration of", "celebrating the life of ...", etc.
2. No advertising is allowed, including logos. However, a business may be mentioned in terms of a person connected with that business: For example, "John Smith – Founder of Smith's Store".
3. FOAP and the Harbor District have the right to deny placing the name of a business on a plaque where the business relates to tobacco, marijuana, alcohol, or other businesses conflicting with FOAP's or the Harbor District's missions.
4. Names of individual members of a group wishing to donate a plaque cannot be included on a plaque due to character space limitations.
5. No inscriptions shall contain language considered offensive, obscene, contrary to community standards or otherwise unsuitable for public display; nor any language that does not maintain the Harbor District's neutrality on political, cultural and religious issues.

Friends of Avila Pier and Port San Luis Harbor District reserve the right to approve the content of the message on the plaque, including the right to reject names and messages that are considered to be inappropriate, illegal or inconsistent with the missions of FOAP or the Harbor District.

AGREEMENT TERMS

Please initial below indicating you agree to the following conditions:

_____The location of the light pole, plaque or numbered bent marker will be selected by the Harbor District.

_____Donor plaques and light poles are the property of the Harbor District. Plaque locations are symbolic and do not represent ownership or entitlement to any property.

_____The Harbor District will not be responsible for replacement of the donor plaque in the event of loss due to vandalism or acts of God. I/we do not expect our plaque to remain on the pier in perpetuity.

_____The Harbor District reserves the right to remove the light pole, bent marker, or plaque if it is damaged or defaced and maintains the right to relocate the plaque, light pole, or bent marker if necessary due to pier construction or unforeseen circumstances (e.g., storms). The Harbor District will attempt to notify the donor of the new location of the plaque.

_____I/we believe my/our plaque application complies with the Program Guidelines as stated above.
